Indiscriminate use of chemicals has resulted in evolution of new races/strains of pathogens. There are remarkable developments in the field of molecular detection of plant pathogens, which enabled correct identification and diagnosis of the diseases caused by them.

The recombinant DNA technology has paved the path to develop transgenic crop plants resistant to major threatening diseases.
